## **Report to the Governing Body of Haslingden Primary School**

## **Sports Premium Funding - End of Financial Year Report**

## **Background**

- 1. In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.
- 2. Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils, including: primary, middle, special and non-maintained special schools, academies and pupil referral units from 1 September 2013. A typical primary school will receive about £9,250 annually in the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15.
- 3. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

How did we spend the money?

- The recruitment and retention of a highly qualified specialist teacher and HLTA.
- Membership of 'Rossendale Schools Partnership' enabled access to training, support, resources and competitions.
- The cost of travel to competitions and associated supply costs.
- The expansion of after school and lunchtime clubs at no cost to pupils.
- The purchasing of resources to expand the range of sporting chance offered in school.
- CPD opportunities for staff.

'The new primary school sport funding has been spent exceptionally well. It is providing a specialist sports teacher to deliver high quality physical education lessons across the school and to enable the school to expand the lunchtime and after-school clubs to pupils. Training for school staff is undertaken through the 'Rossendale Schools Partnership', which also allows pupils wider access to sporting competitions and resources.'

'After-school provision which is well attended and pupils have opportunities to engage in a wide range of activities.'

What outcomes are we working towards in 2014/2015?

- Outstanding PE provision across the school
- All children to have access to competitive competition including an athletics competition on sports day
- The majority of children in Years 6 and most children in Year 5 to have access to inter school competitions across a range of sports.
- PE Kite Mark
- Identification of able and gifted children and established pathways to local clubs/coaching
- Further expand outdoor adventurous provision
- Further develop the work for 'Change for Life' club
- Wider participation in school sporting clubs especially by female pupils
